

New Pesticide License requirements take effect January 1st, 2021.



As of January 1st 2021, Ontario, British Columbia, Nova Scotia, New Brunswick, PEI, Newfoundland and Quebec, will require producers to have a pesticide license to purchase Class C products. Class C products include the majority of pesticides that we market in our insect control and rodent control categories.

Farmers Farmacy Customer Service staff are available to record your pesticide license number and keep it on file, so it's ready when you order.

If your farm does not have an active/valid pesticide license, you must obtain one to purchase most pesticides.

Producers in all other provinces should look online for courses and requirements that are specific to your province. Pesticide licenses are administered by a Provincial Ministry and details can usually be found on your province's main website, and by doing a Google search for "pesticide license" and the name of your province or click one of the links below. These links, as well as the Farm Declaration Form (required if you live in Alberta, Saskatchewan, or Manitoba), will also be found online at farmersfarmacy.com under "Links" in the "Resources" drop down.
